### Class Lists/Back to School Testing/Meetings

Report cards will either be sent home on the last day of school or mailed home. All information regarding next year will be included with your child's report card. Please look for this information as it will also include class lists for next year along with scheduled testing times or meetings for the following school year.



### **Summer School**

Summer School will be held for two weeks in the month of July. Letters will be sent home to interested students. If you would like for your child to attend summer school, please send your child's letter ASAP as it may fill up quickly. Further information regarding dates and times will be sent home in the middle of May. If you did not receive a letter and would like your child to participate, let

your child's classroom teacher know. Enrollment will be open to all students. This program provides students with the opportunity to maintain and gain skills needed to be successful in the educational environment. This is not an alternative for a student who has been identified for retention. As with any educational opportunity, excellent attendance and student effort is expected.

When students return for back-to-school testing, they will need to turn in the calendar with the parent's signature in order to be eligible for the prizes. ### **Summer School**

Big Sandy students are required to meet high, academic standards. Sometimes we have to go beyond the regular school year to catch up with expectations. For a high school student looking to regain credits or a junior high student needing to pass a course to advance to the next grade, he/she can take an on-line class through Colorado Digital Learning Solutions. The summer school session runs June 7<sup>th</sup> through July 30<sup>th</sup>, and after completion this would be for a semester credit. The cost of these courses are \$100. You can register for courses at: <a href="www.coloradodls.org">www.coloradodls.org</a>. At this time we do not offer summer school for junior high or high school students at the school. There are other options available for summer school, but would first need to be approved by Mr. Thieman or Mrs. Swennes before credit would be accepted from another source.



The Negative Factor/Budget Stability Factor is the shortage to schools that should be given to them by constitutional mandates, but the state keeps it back to balance the state budget. There has been over 100 bills dealing with education this year with the biggest probably being the passage of universal preschool starting next year which creates a new state department.

### **Cumulative Records File**

Each senior will be receiving an envelope of documents that include: cumulative file data, official transcripts, and immunization records. It is important to keep a copy of the transcript and immunization records as they will be needed as time goes on. I will also keep a copy of this information permanently on file at the school. Please note that we do not keep copies of diplomas in the permanent file; only a transcript, which is the official documentation of your graduation from Simla High School.

### **Official Transcripts**

At the end of the semester, I will send an official high school transcript for each of our seniors attending college next year. No action from our students is needed for the official high school transcript.

### **College Credit Courses**

Seniors who have taken college credit courses in high school <u>must request their official college transcripts</u> directly from the college where they took the course. We do not receive college transcripts and we are not able to request them. It is the student's responsibility to contact the college and request that an official transcript be sent to their new college. There may be a fee charged with this process. I recommend that the student start by searching how to request a transcript on the sending school's website.

### **JUNIORS**

### **Community Service**

Juniors should look for opportunities to be involved in the community over the summer. Colleges and scholarship committees are looking for students who are able to document community service experience. We have opportunities in Simla at the Thrift Store, at CrossRoads, at the library, through Youth Baseball, etc. Where can you volunteer this summer?

### **Portfolios**

Summer break is a great time to start organizing your portfolios in preparation for completing scholarship applications. Samples of award certificates, honors received, and community service records/logs will be useful as you enter your senior year.

### **SOPHOMORES**

### **PSAT 10**

Our sophomores took the PSAT 10 on April 13th. Students will receive their results via their Student

College Board Accounts in May. This was also a great practice opportunity for them if they are interested

in qualifying for the National Merit Scholarship contest next fall. That scholarship uses the results of their

fall  $11^{\text{th}}$  grade PSAT (optional) assessment as its qualifier so they will already be familiar with the test.

### **FRESHMEN**

### PSAT 9

Our freshmen took the PSAT 9 on April 13th. Students will receive their results via their Student College Board Accounts in May. Taking the PSAT this year gives them good practice for the PSAT 10 and then the SAT when they are juniors.

### ALL SECONDARY STUDENTS

Pre-registration for next year's courses will begin the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of May for each 5<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> grader. I will speak to each grade and hand out scheduling forms. Parent approval is required on all schedules.

The School Board's approved graduation requirements are:

(1 unit = 1 year or 2 semesters)

4 units English

3 units Math (Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra 2 are our expected math courses)

3 units Science

3 units Social Studies (U.S. History, World History, and Civics are required)

1 unit Computers

1 unit Physical Education

1 unit Personal & Workforce Readiness (Senior Seminar)

<u>11 units</u> Electives (any courses completed in addition to the above list)

27 total credits required for graduation

Foreign language is <u>not required for graduation</u> but it may be important for college admission.

Each student is <u>also</u> required to demonstrate adequate preparation in both English and Math. This may be demonstrated in a variety of ways including standardized test scores or passing our capstone senior seminar project. Meeting this requirement must be reported to the state and I will take care of making sure each of our seniors have the opportunity to meet this standard.

An extended-study college course is being offered by Mrs. Montague at the school in English Composition through CU-Denver. Opportunities for online college courses through the Community College system and through CLDS are also available. Juniors and seniors may take as many of these courses as they choose as long as they fit into their ICAP (Individual Career and Academic Plan) and they pay 50% of the course tuition per class. The costs for the courses will be finalized in the fall. Your portion should be paid to Big Sandy Schools by **TUESDAY**, **AUGUST 30**, **2022**. Minimum SAT scores may be required to enroll but if your scores are not high enough then you may also attempt the Accuplacer assessment to qualify. If you earn less than a College D, do not complete the course, or do not drop the course by the drop date, then you are responsible to reimburse the school for the other 50% of the tuition paid on your behalf. No portion of college tuition is refunded at the end of the year.

Only juniors and seniors may take an online course. Courses cost \$100 per semester. Mr. Thieman has a hand out from Colorado Digital Learning Solutions for fall 2022 offerings. Online courses require commitment and the ability to complete assignments independently. Not every student is a good match for online courses so Mr. Thieman and Mrs. Swennes will need to approve all requests for online enrollment. The following criteria are being followed for the 2022-2023 school year:

- 1. If you have previously failed an online course then you will not be able to enroll in another one.
- 2. If we offer the course in our regular schedule and there is not a schedule conflict then you will not be able to enroll in that course online.
- 3. You will be assigned to a regular classroom teacher during the period(s) you are working on your online courses.

Specific decisions to allow a student to take on online course will be made on a case by case basis. You are required to pay your 1st semester tuition by **TUESDAY**, **AUGUST 30**, **2022**. As long as you pass the course, you will be reimbursed this amount at the end of the semester. If you take an online course and fail it or choose not to complete it then your tuition will not be reimbursed.
