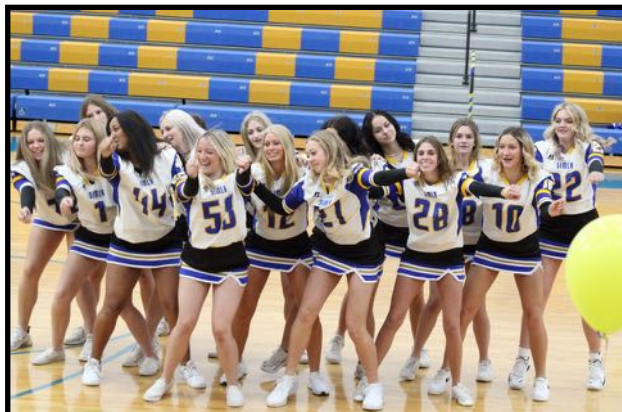
High School Volleyball and Football are both finishing up their regular seasons and are looking at a postseason opportunity. We will know more the first week of November.

Attendance

As is our trend, our first quarter attendance was high at 95%. This can be attributed to your commitment to get your children to school. Thank you for your help as we pursue a 95% rate, which is our accreditation goal. As a reminder, if your child is sick and will miss school for the day, please call the office at 541-2291 before 9:00 a.m. If you would like us to collect homework for the day, please let the office know, when you call in, to give teachers the chance to gather it and bring it to the office by the end of the day. If your child is sick, please keep them home. We are excited that we were able to have a 95% attendance rate for the first quarter.

NHS Reminder

Students having a cumulative 3.5 GPA after the first semester of their sophomore year are eligible for consideration of membership in the National Honor Society. This decision is made by a faculty committee. The committee also considers a student's character, leadership abilities, and community service. This process will begin in February.

Junior High Incentive Trip

At the end of each quarter the junior high staff and myself are implementing an incentive activity that 6th – 8th grade students can qualify for based on grades, attendance, tardies and behavior. Our goal is to award those students who are working hard and making good decisions, but also motivate students to continue this all school year. Students who qualified for the 1st quarter trip had a breakfast at the school on October 28th. To qualify students had to meet the qualifications in 4 out of the 4 areas--4 or less absences for the quarter (medical absences were excused), 3 or less tardies in every class, no office referrals that resulted in; in school or out of school suspension, or 6 or less detentions from classroom teachers and they have to have a 70% or above in all classes.

Lockers

There have been some things stolen out of hallway lockers and locker room lockers. I have combination locks that can be rented for \$10.00 each, and the \$10.00 deposit will be returned when the lock is returned.

All Secondary Students

1st quarter progress reports were sent out in October. The 1st quarter Honor Roll is based on these progress grades. As a reminder, grades do not reset at the end of quarter. Semester grades are cumulative running from August 16 – December 22 and are only posted to transcripts at the end of the term. 1st quarter progress grades are not posted to transcripts and do not affect cumulative GPA's.

ACT

Students may register for the December 10th test administration through November 4th for regular registration and through November 11th for late registration. The regular registration fee for the ACT is \$63. Go to www.actstudent.org for more information and all of the 2022-2023 test dates

SAT

The next SAT administration will be December 3rd. The registration deadline is November 3rd. The late registration deadline is November 22nd. The regular registration for the SAT is \$55. Information may be found at www.collegeboard.org. All juniors will take the SAT at no cost here at the school on April 12, 2023 at the school on April 13th.

PSAT/NMSQT

The PSAT/NMSQT was administered at the school October 12th to sophomores and juniors who had signed up to take this assessment. Juniors may qualify for a National Merit Scholarship based on their PSAT/NMSQT scores. Scores should be available by mid-November.

Seniors

Seniors took advantage of the free college application days October 18th – 20th. All public colleges and universities in Colorado waived their application fees for that day. Seniors also continue to work on scholarships that are due this fall. Scholarship information and applications are provided to the seniors on a regular basis. *Our seniors have also started working on their senior project which includes an 8-page research paper on the benefits and challenges related to their career choice. This senior project culminates in a PowerPoint presentation to be given in December before a panel of professionals from our local communities*

Senior Parents

The FAFSA opened October 1st. Complete this application with your student (there is a parent section and a student section) as soon as possible in order to receive Financial Aid Award letters. Some colleges are sending out award packages earlier than they have in the past so that you have more time to compare costs/financial aid awards I am glad to help you complete the FAFSA and ensure confidentiality with any financial information that is shared with me. You and your student need to complete a FSA ID at www.fsaed.gov in order to sign the FAFSA electronically. The FAFSA can be completed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. This is a free site. You will need your financial information from your 2021 submitted tax returns. The FAFSA will allow you to have that information transferred automatically from the IRS if you choose to do so.

Former Students/College Graduates

If you have previously attended college and took out loans to help pay for your college tuition and expenses, then make sure to check out <https://studentaid.gov/debt-relief/application> to see if you qualify for loan forgiveness. It is a short application form and you will be informed in the future if you qualify.

All Students

Mr. Thieman is available anytime to talk with students in all grades. Information shared by students is kept confidential unless there is a perceived threat of self-harm by the student or toward another person. Please encourage your student to stop by the counseling office any time that they may need to.

Nurse's Notes **Maggie Volosin, School Nurse**

As a friendly reminder the state of Colorado requires that all students be current with all required vaccinations OR have a current immunization exemption on file at the school.

If you have not yet done so yet, please provide an up-to-date immunization record or current exemption to the school as soon as possible. I will start sending out letters in November to those who we do not have an up-to-date immunization record or current exemptions on file for.

My goal is to have all of this information collected by December 15th, 2022. Please provide a current immunization record to the school prior to that date.

Please read the following information for details and requirements to be considered compliant with the state immunization requirements.

Immunizations:

Required and recommended vaccines

- Colorado law requires students who attend a public, private, or parochial kindergarten - 12th grade school to be vaccinated against many of the diseases vaccines can prevent, unless an exemption is filed. For more information, visit colorado.gov/cdphe/schoolrequiredvaccines (or cdphe.colorado.gov/schoolrequiredvaccines).
- **Your student must be vaccinated against:**
 - diphtheria, tetanus & pertussis (DTaP, DTP, Tdap)
 - polio (IPV)
 - measles, mumps, rubella (MMR)
 - hepatitis B (HepB)
 - varicella (chickenpox)
- Colorado follows recommendations set by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. Students entering kindergarten must receive their final doses of DTaP, IPV, MMR and varicella. Students entering 6th grade must receive one dose of Tdap vaccine, even if they are under 11 years of age. You can view recommended vaccine schedules for children 0-6 years of age at cdc.gov/vaccines/parents/downloads/parent-ver-sch-0-6yrs.pdf and preteens/teens 7 - 18 years of age at cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/downloads/teen/parent-version-schedule-7-18yrs.pdf.
- Vaccines are recommended for hepatitis A, influenza, meningococcal disease and human papillomavirus, but are not required.

Exclusion from school:

- Your student may be excluded from school if your school does not have an up-to-date vaccine record, exemption, or in-process plan for your student on file.
- If someone gets sick with a vaccine-preventable disease or there is an outbreak at your student's school and your student has not received the vaccine for that disease, they may be excluded from school activities. That could mean lost learning time for them and lost work and wages for you. For example, if your student has not received a measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine, they may be excluded from school for 21 days after someone gets sick with measles. Immunization Exemption Process:

From 2022-2023 CDPHE parent letter:

- If your student cannot get vaccines because of medical reasons, you must submit a *Certificate of Medical Exemption* to your school, signed by a health care provider licensed to give vaccines. You only need to submit this certificate once, unless your student's information or school changes. You can get the form at cdphe.colorado.gov/vaccine-exemptions.
- If you choose not to have your student vaccinated according to the current recommended schedule because of personal belief or religious reasons, you must submit a *Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption* to your school.

Nonmedical exemptions must be submitted annually at every new school year (July 1 through June 30th of the following year).

There are two ways to file a nonmedical exemption.

- File the *Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption* WITH a signature from an immunizing provider, OR
- **File the Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption received upon the completion of our online education module.**

*** IF you do not have the exemption certificate signed by your child's primary care provider you MUST take the ONLINE EDUCATION MODULE found at the below link.
