Extra-Curricular Activities:

We also offer a variety of academic clubs/teams like Matchwits, Future Business Leaders of America and National Honor Society. Students may also participate in Student Council, TrueSport, and Fellowship of Christian Athletes in the high school and C.U.B.S. Crew in the Junior High.

We are very proud of all of the students that participate in these extra-curricular activities! They are willing to commit the time and dedication to make Simla Junior High and High School the best that it can be. I would like to personally invite you and your family to come to one of our ball games or meets to watch our students in action.

Attendance: A Key to Your Student's Success

In a recent edition of <u>The Parent Institute</u>, the following clip was published. It stresses the importance of regular attendance at school.

Research shows that children who are in school most of the time do better on state tests. Here's how you can improve your child's school attendance:

- 1. Talk with your child about the importance of attending school regularly.
- 2. Avoid scheduling family trips or doctor appointments during school hours.
- 3. Make sure your child stays healthy by eating nutritious food and getting enough sleep and exercise.
- 4. Don't accept excuses for why your child "must" miss or be late to school.
- 5. Discuss with your child what happened at school each day.
- 6. Support school rules and consequences for skipping class and being tardy.
- 7. Show your child why education is important and give specific examples of how education helps people succeed.

Thus far, we have done a wonderful job of being present and ready to learn. Our secondary school reported a 95% attendance rate this past year. This year we want to try to do even better. Thank you, our students and parents, for the commitment to Big Sandy Schools and our drive for excellence. With all that being said, we do want your child to stay home if they are sick. We are still in a COVID year, and the best way for us to stay open for in person learning is if student stay home when they aren't feeling well. As much as we want students in school, we want them in school healthy even more. Please call the office if your child isn't feeling well, and if you do go to the doctor, please bring a doctor's note back to the office when your child returns to school. Let's all work together to stay healthy and stay in person this year!

1/2 Day Policy

Secondary students participating in extra -curricular activities (sports and clubs) must be in attendance a ½ day in order to practice or play in an event for that same day. The definition of a ½ day is 4 hours of attendance in a school day. If a bus is leaving after 12:00 p.m. the student must be in attendance for 4 hours of that school day. If the bus is leaving earlier than 12:00 p.m. the student must be in attendance for all hours in that school day.

Expectations of Parents and Fans at Games

Our expectation for all parents and fans at games is to have appropriate behavior at all times. The use of inappropriate language, heckling of the opposing teams' players and coaches, heckling of our own players and coaches, and inappropriate behavior and language towards an official are inexcusable. If behavior from any of our parents or fans is inappropriate in any way you may be asked to leave the game by a school administrator. School administration will then determine if you will be allowed to attend future extracurricular events. Our goal is not to remove parents or fans from games, but instead hold our parents and fans to the same high sportsmanship standards that we hold our students too.

Expectations of Students at Games

If your child attends a ball game, please make sure that he/she is supervised and watches the game. If staff needs to correct a student, then the student will receive consequences such as a lunch or after school detention and the student will need to sit with the parent or with the adult who brought him/her to the game. If inappropriate behavior continues then the student will need to stay home and not attend extracurricular activities until the administration decides that he or she is ready to follow the rules. Thank you for your cooperation. We have these rules so the patrons can watch the games and to try and ensure student safety.

Superintendent/Board Notes Steve Wilson, Superintendent

The majority of our first 9-weeks is finished. We have had a great start with student learning and extra-curricular activities. So far, we have had minimal disruptions and have had many positive things going on.

With continued consistent quality teaching and learning each day and week throughout the year, we expect a good year of education.

Our longtime Transportation Director will be retiring at the end of this school year. If anyone has an interest in being our full-time Transportation Director which includes being our school mechanic, scheduling bus routes and trips with our drivers, teaching auto mechanic classes... Please let me know.

EPA

We submitted a federal EPA grant for over a million dollars to receive some electric school buses and charging stations; we will be notified in October whether or not we were selected from a lottery. We also submitted another ESSER grant in which the state gave us three days to turn it in as they had money to "use it or lose it" from the federal government; we will be notified one way or another within the next couple of weeks.

Audit Report

Our annual auditing report will probably be finalized within a month or so. On the initial exit interview, things were positive. If our audit shows that we are 1) Honest, 2) Competent 3) Have Good Fund Balances, then I believe we had a good financial year. We also are going through a CDE

(Colorado Department of Education) audit which happens every 3-5 years.

Scheduling Appointments

Please continue to make it a point to try and schedule appointments and errands on the days that we do not have school (Mondays) if possible; with only 147 scheduled school days during the year, every day of instruction is important for student learning.

Safety Procedures

For everyone's safety, please reinforce and discuss bike riders' safety procedures as well as safety procedures with those children that walk to and from school. There are three "drop and go" pick up and drop off areas; the high school "drop and go" is underutilized and if used, might give some relief to the other two areas.

Thank You!

Thank you to Kevin Braun for serving on our school board. He recently moved out of our school district and had to resign as a board member. If anyone has an interest to finish out Mr. Braun's term of a little over a year, please write a letter of interest to the school board and turn it in to me.

SCHOOL CLOSURE INFORMATION

Finally, we try and make the decision on school closures by 6:00 a.m. Our first contact is with www.flashalert.net.

FlashAlert then contacts all media outlets in Colorado Springs, Denver, and Pueblo. These media outlets then post school closures on their websites, radio stations, and television stations. We also use ShoutPoint. ShoutPoint is an automatic calling system and e-mailing system that will call/e-mail each family to give out this type of information; please let Alisa Easler know in the main office if you need to update a phone

number, e-mail address, or address.

Seniors:

Researching Future Programs

Our seniors are currently researching degree programs and college/vocational & technical school/apprenticeship options.

We have been making use of online resources including a state-sponsored website known as My Colorado Journey. This site provides guidance in career planning, college planning, and financial aid. Currently the seniors are working through the College Application Month materials in preparation for the FREE college/university application days which will be over 3 days:

October 18th-20th. I recommend that parents check out this website as well. The web address is: www.mycoloradojourney.com.

Scholarships:

Seniors need to remember to sign up in the scholarship book to receive the applications that arrive in my office. We continually update our scholarship list and are always looking for new information to add. If you find out about a scholarship opportunity that is not included on our list, please let me know. We also have a link to our scholarship spreadsheet on the school website: www.bigsandy100j.com. Another useful online resource to search for scholarships is found at www.fastweb.com.

FAFSA!

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opens October 1st. Financial information is taken from you and your parent's 2021 Federal tax returns. The first step in the process is to apply for an FSA ID at www.fsaid.ed.gov. This username and password is used to sign the completed FAFSA application. The FAFSA can be completed at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Remember that this application process is free! If you encounter something requiring payment then you are on the wrong site. You must apply and be accepted at a college in order for them to complete a Financial Aid • package for you. Please contact me if you have questions or need assistance in this process.

There are several scholarship applications that are open right now and seniors should be working on those applications. It is important to not wait until the last minute to complete applications! I regularly remind our seniors that they will not have enough time during senior seminar class to complete all of their applications – they must use additional time away from school to accomplish all that needs to be done!

Our seniors will be attending a college fair in Limon on Wednesday, October 12th.

Senior Seminar Participation Policy:

Virtually all of the content of the senior seminar course is given in class through direct student/teacher contact. Because it is so important to be in class for this instruction, we have a clear participation policy. If a student is present and participating, they receive 5 daily points. If a student is not present or is not participating, they do not receive the points for that day. The only non-participation excuses accepted are: 1. college visits/job shadows; 2. other school related events such as early dismissal for athletics; and 3. a doctor's written release from attendance/participation. If a student does not earn their participation points for the day, they will have the opportunity to complete an extra credit assignment at the end of the quarter to earn additional points. This policy is necessary to help ensure that our seniors are present and participating in class on a regular basis.

JUNIORS & SOPHOMORES:

We will be giving the PSAT/NMSQT assessment on Wednesday, October 12th. This optional test for 10th & 11th graders is a practice for the SAT and is the qualifier for <u>Juniors</u> to be in the National Merit Scholarship program. Entry into the scholarship competition is determined solely by the PSAT/NMSQT score. See Mr. Thieman for more details and to sign up for the test if you would like to take it.

ALL HS GRADES:

To meet the Higher Education Admissions Requirements (HEAR) for Colorado's public colleges and universities, graduating students should have completed: 4 years of English; 4 years of Math (Alg. 1 and higher); 3 years each of Science and Social Studies; 1 year of Foreign Language (Simla offers Spanish); and 2 additional years of academic electives. (**Foreign Language is not required for graduation at Simla and only 3 years of high school math are required.) Keep

these college admission requirements in mind when choosing the types of courses to take each year.

ACT and SAT Assessments

The next <u>ACT</u> test date is Saturday,
December 10th. Registration is open
through November 4th and the cost is
\$63.00. Go to <u>www.act.org</u> to register
for the ACT.

All enrolled juniors will take the <u>SAT</u> here at the school on Wednesday,
April 12th, 2023.

FYI – students who take Algebra I during their 8th grade year are still required to complete 3 more high school level math classes between their 9th and 12th grade years. Our expectation is that each high school student has successfully completed Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2 as a regular course of mathematics study.

Each Tuesday morning the eligibility report is posted for all junior high and high school students. If a student has a course grade of 60% - 65%, then their name appears on the Near-to-Fail list. If a student has less than a 60%, then their name appears on the Failing list. Students must be on the Near to Fail list once in a specific class **before** being declared ineligible no matter what their grade is – so every student has a 1-week grace period to raise their % to a passing level again before they can be declared ineligible. Letters are sent home to alert parents that their student is on one of these lists. Login to Infinite Campus to check current grades if you receive a letter. Any athlete who is on the Failing list in one class will not be eligible to play in any of that week's athletic contests. Their eligibility is regained once the next list is published on the following Tuesday if they have a 60% or higher in that class. Please feel free to call myself or Mrs. Swennes directly if you have questions about this process. Our Internet-based student information program, Infinite Campus, offers parents and students a portal to check current grades, attendance information, etc. Call (541-2291) or email (ttucker@bigsandy100j.org) Mr. Tucker for information on how to get a login to access the system. IMMUNIZATIONS:

As I prepare to start reviewing immunization records for each student, please make sure you have provided an up-to-date immunization record to the school for each student. All students entering Kindergarten are required by state law to have the MMR, Varicella, Dtap, Polio, and Hepatitis B vaccines. In addition to those vaccines, students entering the 6th grade are also required to have a Tdap vaccine. If you choose to exempt your child from any or all **required** vaccines, the exemption process changed in August 2021with the passing of Senate Bill 163. Below is the letter from Immunize Colorado explaining the new exemption process. While a medical exemption for those children who cannot be vaccinated and a nonmedical exemption for those who choose not to vaccinate remains an option for Colorado families, the new law makes the following changes:

- Parents and caregivers claiming a medical exemption from vaccination for their child must have a
 completed certificate of medical exemption with the signature of a healthcare provider. Medical
 exemptions only need to be submitted once, unless the student's information or school changes.
- If a parent or caregiver chooses not to have their child vaccinated, they may claim a nonmedical exemption in one of two ways:
 - o Submit the official Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption with the signature of an immunizing provider (such as a medical doctor, advanced practice nurse, pharmacist, etc.) OR
 - o <u>Submit the official Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption received upon completion of</u> **CDPHE's Online Immunization Education Module.**
 - •Use the following link: https://cdphe.colorado.gov/vaccine-exemptions
 - •Scroll to the bottom and complete the "Online Immunization Education Module" .This can be done once for all children in a family.

Note: Nonmedical exemptions for school-aged children must be submitted annually and expire on June 30th of each year. If a student exempts from one or more school-required vaccines for either medical or nonmedical reasons, the appropriate exemption form, as described above, MUST be on file with their school. The certificate was standardized to include the collection of information necessary in the event of a disease outbreak in our community.

 All immunizing health care providers are required to report both immunizations and exemptions to the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS). Parents and caregivers retain the right to opt their child out of CIIS.
