- I. Charley called the meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.
- II. Board Report/School Reports
  - a. Board-Our audit has been completed, and things are looking great. One electric bus has been delivered, and two more are on the way. The state made \$1000 grants available to teachers, and we had 23 teachers receive it. On the second round, fifteen more teachers qualified. School board elections will be in November. Tonight, there will be an Excel meeting in the cafeteria. They are wanting to run power/transmission lines to the west of the school. Excel has not presented an official plan yet. Al and Sue Snyder will be inducted into the CHASSA's hall of fame.
  - b. Elementary- On October 4th, UCCS brought eight student teachers to tour our school. This is a great opportunity for them to learn about rural education. In the past, we have had about three teachers from this group teach at our school. We have had a great first quarter. The quarter will end on Friday, and parent/ teacher conferences will be on October 23, by appointment. Our goal is 100% contact with every parent either in person or by phone. Count day was on Tuesday, and the elementary's official count was 154 students, preK-5th grade. On October 25th, the elementary will be hosting a "STEAM" night for students and their families. The fire department will be giving a fire safety presentation to all elementary students on October 26th. We appreciate them always being willing to teach our students about fire safety. On October 31st, we will be hosting our annual "Trunk or Treat" and are looking for parents, community members, and friends to participate. Halloween parties will take place after the trunk or treat, and a parade will take place before in front of the school.
  - c. Secondary-Parent/teacher conferences were held in the secondary, and we had a great turnout. The first choir concert was held at the end of September. Ms. Trowbridge did an outstanding job. Matchwits is underway. Some members attended a STUCO leadership conference. The end of the first quarter will be on Friday, and the JH incentive this quarter will be a breakfast "Nertz" tournament. We will be hosting the JH BFL volleyball tournament in a couple of weeks. Mr. Cox is taking a group of art students to the Art Museum tomorrow. Cheerleaders are hosting a mini cheer camp the next couple of days, and an elementary volleyball camp is also being offered.
