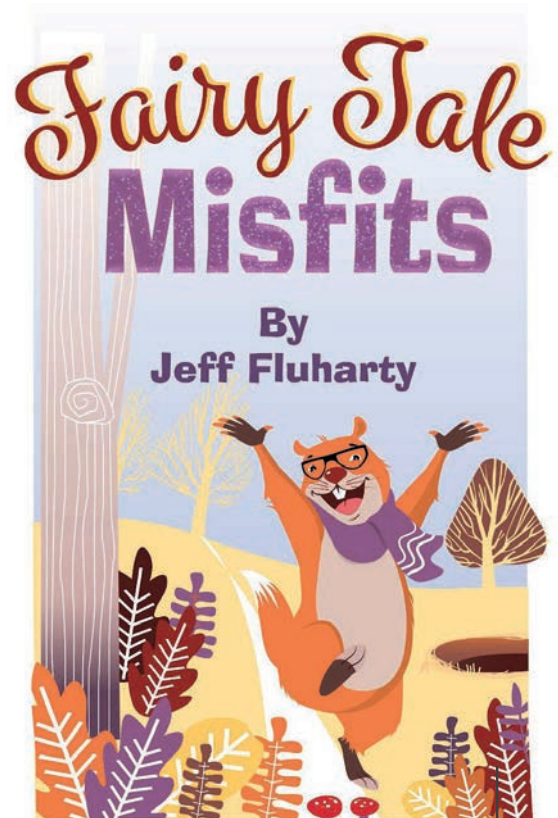
BACK UP BASKETBALL CLOCK KEEPER

SENIORS

It's the first of December! Hopefully seniors have applied to their top choices for college and have been receiving notifications of acceptance. I encourage all of our seniors to work hard in the weeks before Christmas to get their college applications submitted.

In Senior Seminar, our Senior Projects are wrapping up and 8-page research papers will be handed in soon! Based on their research, each student is also creating a PowerPoint presentation to give before a panel of judges from our community Dec. 18 th – 20 th . The senior who is judged to have the best overall presentation will win a gift card!

This year we again required a job shadow experience for each senior. I hope that this was a valuable time in helping our students get a first-hand and practical look at the day-to-day requirements of their career choice. Parents – thank you for helping your student complete this requirement!

In January we plan to begin a Personal Finance unit in conjunction with Farmers State Bank, work through the job application and interview processes, and continue to work on scholarship applications. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should be available soon. Google "FAFSA" to find the link to the online application. Financial information comes from your families completed 2022 tax forms. This is a free process so if you encounter any charges being requested then you have accessed the wrong site. In order to complete and digitally sign your completed FAFSA you will need a FSA account. The process for obtaining this is found by searching "Federal Student Aid Account". You are looking for the site: studentaid.gov for both the FAFSA and the account creation. I am always willing to help you go through these applications and provide as much guidance as I can!

Farmers State Bank is hosting a financial aid night for parents on Tuesday, Dec. 5 th from 6 – 7 p.m. at the Calhan School. FAFSA expert Jeanette Rojas will be the presenter. I would recommend attending if you are able to do so.

ACT

The next test date for the ACT is February 10th . The regular registration deadline for this test is January 5th . Register at www.actstudent.org. The

test fee for the ACT is \$68.00.

SAT

The next test date for the SAT is March 9 th . The regular registration deadline for this test is February 23 rd . The test fee for the SAT is \$60.00. Register at www.sat.org by choosing the SAT tab. All juniors will be taking the SAT at Simla on April 17th at no charge as part of the State's assessment program.

ALL SECONDARY STUDENTS – CHANGING YOUR SCHEDULE

December 21 st marks the end of the 1 st semester! If you would like to change your schedule for the 2nd semester, you must pick up a schedule change form from my office (this includes 2nd semester online & college courses). 4 signatures are required: Teacher from the class that you are dropping; Teacher from the class that you are adding; Parents; and Counselor. Forms will need to be handed in by Friday, December 15th .

ALL SECONDARY STUDENTS - ASVAB

The ASVAB (military readiness assessment) is planned for Wednesday, January 17 th at 9 a.m. at the school. High school students can sign up in my office to take this optional assessment. There is no cost.

In your holiday traveling, make time to stop and visit some college campuses along the way. One of the best ways to learn about a college is to set foot on campus.

Remember that my office is always open to talk about whatever that you would like. Stop by anytime!

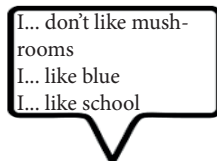
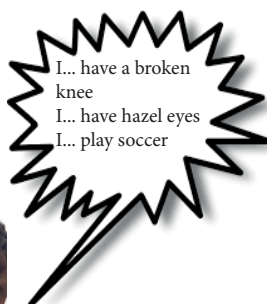

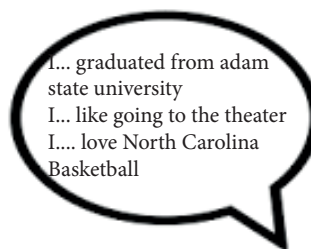
