- II. Board/School Report
  - a. Board-Our counselor, Mr. Thieman, was recognized by the state as an outstanding counselor. Parent/teacher conferences will be held on March 6th from 3-8 pm. Our annual Read Across America celebration will be held the last week of February. If we reach our collective goal of 1000 books, we will have a minute to win it party on Friday afternoon.
  - c. Secondary-We just had a state wrestling send off today. They will compete tomorrow, Friday, and Saturday. Several students qualified for state competition in FBLA. There will be a baseball game during state FBLA. The Denver Broncos will be supplying football helmets for our players over a four-year period.
